Mrs. Cox graduated from Lodi High School in 1933, worked at Bank of America and PG&E, and married Oscar Cox in 1949. She was an active member of the Lodi Memorial Hospital Emperor Auxiliary and the Women’s Club of Lodi. In 1986, she was honored by the Lodi Chamber of Commerce as a “Volunteer of the Year.”

The Arthur C. Boehmer and Florence Schubert Boehmer Scholarship Fund, established in Lodi, CA in 1980, is now managed by the LMH Foundation.

Born in 1895, Dr. Boehmer was a graduate of the University of Illinois Medical School at Chicago. Dr. Boehmer and his wife, Florence, moved to Lodi in 1917 where he practiced medicine until his retirement in 1952. He was a member of the original Board of Directors of Lodi Memorial Hospital in 1946, served as director of the San Joaquin County Local Health District, President of the San Joaquin Medical Society and was active in other community organizations. Mrs. Boehmer was active in Lodi Women's Club and the Order of Eastern Star.

Awarded to a student within the Adventist Health Lodi Memorial service area with priority to medical-tech or nursing students

Nancy Watts (1941-2022) arrived in Lodi in 1969, with a degree from Cal State Fresno. She had a long teaching career, which included Lodi Senior Elementary where she taught a variety of subjects such as math and reading. She also taught at the Lodi Adult School and as an Adjunct Professor for Chapman College after receiving her MA from Cal State Sacramento. Nancy was an original member of the Lodi Unified School District Technology Task Force and served on the Lodi Chamber of Commerce Education Committee.

Nancy Watts served on the Lodi Memorial Hospital Foundation Board of Directors for nearly 25 years. She was the Chair for the Scholarship Committee.

Following the passing of Nancy in 2022, her husband Harlin Watts made a gift of \$200,000 to create a scholarship endowment fund to provide perpetual funds for annual scholarships.

He helped found the first Mosquito Abatement District in the county and was a lifetime member of the Lodi Lion's Club. In 1982 he was selected as Outstanding Citizen for the City of Lodi.
